### Counselling

Our counsellors develop a long-term relationship with individuals, families, community groups and other non-government organisations to help build a holistic approach to community support.

### \$1500 bill payment package (Once off payment for Primary Producers)

Rural Aid is offering Primary Producers in drought, flood or fire affected areas a once off \$1500 towards bill payment. If you apply for this \$1500 funding and are not registered with us it will delay the payment process. Once we have received your application and we have verified you in our system our team will review and process all approved applications within 14 working days.

Please note: You must be in a drought declared/affected area, be deemed to be a primary producer and have a current ABN. Your payment will not be paid if you don't meet the criteria. This once off payment is capped at \$1500 and an application for less than \$1500 will see the balance value forfeited.

#### What will I need?

- I am registered with Rural Aid as a farmer. Farmers must be registered with Rural Aid as a farmer to receive
  this assistance. To apply online, go to the following website: <a href="https://www.buyabale.com.au/can-we-help-you/">https://www.buyabale.com.au/can-we-help-you/</a>. Please make sure that you use the same name to register as a farmer and for your financial assistance application.
- Primary Producer Declaration. If your accountant is writing a primary producer declaration for you, please
  ensure it has the letter head and contact details. Or if your accountant is using a Declaration of Eligibility for
  a Registration Concession form or any other form, please make sure that it has your and your accountant's
  signature on it with current date.
- A maximum of three invoices up to \$1500 bill/s. (Note: if you provide us with a bill of \$1600, we will pay \$1500 only)
- All documents are able to be clearly read.
- Biller's bank account details provided. All invoices must have the biller bank account details B Pay Reference & Biller Code or BSB & account number, as we pay the biller directly.

If you do not have any bill for us to pay, we can put credit up to \$1500 towards your paid electricity, rates and water bill (to the biller directly). If this is the case, you must let us know by providing a note in the note section on the application.

# Supporting Communities. Changing Lives.

Just like the reality TV shows that fixes up houses, we recognised there was a need for such a service in the bush.

In tough economic times small business and tradespeople move from smaler towns to bigger ones to secure work and income. This skill-drain, the cost of travel and time and then the cost of doing the job is blown out if supplies are required or multiple trips are needed. These costs are unsustainable for many in rural and remote Australia.

Our Farm + Community Rescue program is about sourcing jobs from farmers and rural communities that need skilled volunteers with the right tools and work tickets, and getting them done through volunteering. Each year sees a number of properties or a community project tackled and is normally within a seven days period.

Our tradespeople are billeted out to farmers and supervised where needed. We support the cost of having the tradies on the farms by covering meals and if required, materials to complete the jobs,

# Supporting Rural Australia

In 2013 a call to arms was made to All Australians: Can you hellp support our farmers and 'Buy a Bale' of hay?

The concept was simple enough...ask Australians to donate and hay would be purchased from hay farmers who needed the income. Truckies would be paid to carry it and farmers could spend what money they had left on other essential items like food for the family instead of food for the animals.

Since then the name Buy a Bale has become synonymous with hay drives all over Australia.

In just a matter of weeks businesses and individuals felt compelled to support our work and purchased thousands of bales. Truckies came out of the woodwork to offer their trucks and time to carry the loads, many hard up at the time suffering from lack of work and depressed rates, so we negotiated to cover their costs and keep them rolling. The farmers and rural communities were amazed at the cutpouring of support and watched as the trucks rolled and the hay arrived.

The emotion, passion and inspiration felt by all involved from donors, hay farmers, bruckies, community members and farmers during this period was amazing. Many truckies met farmers for the first time, enjoyed stories over a beer and many have become lifelong friends,

Today **Buy a Bale** is the bedrock rural support campaign for rural Australia that **Rural Aid** provides. Fodder assistance is not just a drought issue. Supplying feed assistance to flooded areas or wet areas that require food substance for animals means **Rural Aid** is always shipping fodder or supplement support in one way or another.

# We're here for you

**Rural Aid** provides assistance to relieve the poverty, illness, distress or significant and unusual disadvantage of individuals and families who are primary producers.

At a time when we're so meant to be connected as a society, isolation, loneliness, depression, suicide and mental health rates are all climbing. Rates of domestic & family violence are higher in regional & rural areas, due to remoteness & the stresses on farmers as a result of their unique experiences. These issues affect the individual & the family's ability to seek help and access services.

After much consideration we have decided that to meet the increasing crisis in the bush **Rural Aid** will employ qualified, nationally registered counsellors who will visit farmers and rural communities and live within their communities for a minimum of 3 years at a time.

Our counselling service works to support farmers, families and communities with personal one on one consultations where you live.

# We'll help build your team
